South Florida Water Management District:

Federal & State Issues-CERP/IRL & Lake Okeechobee:

Paul Gray announced that the lake is looking healthy and current level is 13-¾ ft., but there is hope that the lake will drop more before the rainy season arrives. The Holey Land, an area south of the lake, is in desperate need of water and also the Caloosahatchee is in need of water to maintain their salinity levels west of the lake, which would be a win-win, lowering the lake level at the same time.

Local Issues & Estuary Water Quality:

Mark Perry announced that some water is being released from the lake at Port Mayaca and also into the Caloosahatchee. The SFWMD is trying to lower the lake to 12 ft. by June 1st to prepare for the rainy season. The local water quality currently looks good due to limited releases. The FOS is continuing to recycle oyster shells and build beds in partnership with local Stuart restaurants.

WRAC - "Water Resources Advisory Commission":

Mark Perry announced that at the past District Advisory Board meeting, they decided to support CEPP, which wouldn't be a solution but a big help to get water moving south. WRAC put together a table illustrating current and planned projects and their current levels of funding and how much more is needed. There will be a WRAC meeting on May 6th in Broward County.

Indian River Keeper:

Marty Baum asked everyone to be proud of the City of Stuart and other towns along the St. Lucie and IRL for passing meaningful fertilizer ordinances. The Land Legacy meeting was held on April 16th on Amendment 1, which would allow us more control over purchases of wetlands to protect our waterways, a 60% victory is needed for it to pass. The River Kidz had an event for Earth Day at the Ft. Pierce Environmental Studies Center, Marty asked everyone to please encourage and support our kids who advocate for the river and are the next generation of torchbearers.
